This is part of a multi-step process to design a finalized website:

- 1. Starting with the wireframe concept
- 2. Creating a navigation structure
- 3. Creating the layout
- 4. Creating the presentation and messaging
- 5. Creating the assets/images/context

PART 01:

Create a wireframe concept on paper for the following:

- 1. A hypothetical website for all the courses you are currently taking
- 2. The website should link to (in no particular order):
 - a. Sections that identify each individual course
 - b. Your email
 - c. The program course content site
 - d. Sheridan's Main site
 - e. Your own blog/portfolio
 - f. Your social media content
- 3. Identify navigational elements and the hierarchy
- 4. Revisit that you have not missed any requirement
- 5. An area designated for a banner (your personal branding)

PART 02:

In Photoshop, using the GRID as a base, create boxes for the necessary elements identified in *Part 01* using design principles of:

- Rule of Thirds
- Proximity
- Alignment
- Repetition

NOTE: Each major section of the preliminary layout should be in its own **Folder** with design elements in the folder for portability. Using Photoshop Folders will help streamline workflow.
